- —At this time, Math 3 and Math Analysis students are beginning to recognize the features of rational functions. For example, they are noticing how the relationship between the number of people contributing money to the cost of a gift and the amount of money that each person would have to contribute is called "inverse variation": as the number of people increases, the amount of money for each decreases. We are seeing how these situation can be demonstrated in both equation and graph forms
- ——— In Photo 1, students are learning about the photography of Ansel Adams and they are taking studio portraits with 3 light sources. Photo 2 is learning about how focal lengths and lensto-subject distances change the way the photo is framed.
- For U.S. History We are doing a stock market researching project where students will "have" \$10,000 for buying and selling stocks, they will be able to check their stocks weekly to see how the Stock Market works. I will be going over the growth of American business in America during the 1920's.
- For Government we are going over new vocabulary terms to proceed with the textbook and different vocabulary terms that they will need to know, we are also going over different supply and demands that they will need to think about as they begin to become young independent adults.
