It's happening in FFA! This past school year, we have been attending many exciting events. October has been a very busy month. Our Ag boosters had a very successful pulled pork fundraiser. The funds will be used to help extend the pens in the Ag area to fit our rapidly expanding program. On October 7th, we took 36 students to the opening and closing competition in Salinas. There, they competed in a collaborative prepared public speaking contest. We had a 2nd place overall officer team and had multiple 1st place students and overall the competitors represented the school very well. The following weekend, the officer team attended a leadership conference in Hollister where they learned team building skills and how to better serve their members in their respective office. We're also getting ready for the Salinas valley fair where our first parent meeting we had approximately 250 parents and guest attending the informational meeting where 84 students signed up to show livestock at the fair. This Thursday we are taking 21 freshmen, also known as Greenhands, to a leadership conference where they will learn how to be more involved in the FFA and how to make a positive change in their home and community. At the end of this month, Justin Massa will be flying to Kentucky and receiving his American Degree-- the highest level of membership an FFA member can earn. Only two percent of all FFA members meet the qualifications to obtain this degree. Currently, we are gearing up for our Greenhand/Chapter Farmer banquet, set to be in mid November. We are also excited to announce that every student within the agriculture academy is placed in a appropriate career pathway. Within each pathway students will earn, by the end of the year, an industry certificate that they will be able to use to get an internship and/or job.
