Student Senate Meeting

The SHS Student Senate met on Thursday, Thursday 17, 2015 during seventh period in the MPR.

Students each reflected on their greatest hope for the 2015-2016 school year. Then they engaged in an activity that caused them to meet and talk with a student they may not normally socialize with. They chatted with a student who was not seated at their table who they made eye contact with. They shared their greatest hope with their eye contact partner. This strategy is a strategy classroom teachers and meeting facilitators can use to have more engagement and active participation in the classroom or in meetings.

Next the Student Senate worked on providing ideas for how school stakeholders might meet the school and district LCAP – Local Control Accountability Plan goals. Three LCAP goals and ideas provided by student senators to achieve the goals are below:

Safe School

- Have more security personnel
- Install metal detectors
- Provide more intervention groups for anger management
- Have school adults interact with students more

Parent Involvement

- Ask parents to get involved
- Work with parents schedules so they can come to school more
- Make parents care

Increase Academic Achievement

- Make sure A-G classes are provided
- Make sure teachers are qualified
- More individual attention to students who need help
- Have the right supplies students need
- Have more options for students who do not speak English
- Teachers need to do more activities, academic games, not just learning by reading and writing, but by doing different activities
