- Highlights
 - Be in assigned seat before late bell
 - 8 tardies = 1 Saturday school

- <u>Credit Requirement</u>: 220 credits completed in specific areas completed in grades 9-12.
 - Most courses at SHS:
 - 1 Semester (1/2 of year) = 5 credits
 - 1 Year = 2 semesters, 10 credits
- Community Service: 40 hours completed in grades 9-12 at a local non-profit organization.

Subject Requirement

The following subjects **must** be fulfilled in completion of the 220 credit requirement:

ENGLISH: 40 credits, 4 years

Grade 9- English 9, 10 credits, 1 year

Grade 10- English 10, 10 credits, 1 year

Grade 11- English 11, 10 credits, 1 year

Grade 12- English 12, 10 credits, 1 year

MATHEMATICS: 30 credits, 3 years
Grade 9- Mathematics I 10 credits,, 1 year
Grade 10-Mathematics II 10 credits, 1 year

Grade 11- Mathematics III 10 credits, 1 year



SOCIAL SCIENCE:

Grade 10- World History, 10 credits, 1 year Grade 11- U.S. History, 10 credits, 1 year Grade 12- U.S. Government & Economics, 10 credits, 1 year

SCIENCE:

- 1. Biological Science: 10 credits, 1 year Biology or Sustainable Ag.
- 2. Physical Science: 10 credits, 1 year Integ Sci, Chemistry & Physics

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: 20 credits, 2 years of the same language Spanish/ Native Spanish/ French

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: 20 credits,2 years.

HEALTH: 5 credits & Get Focused, Stay Focused: 5 credits

VISUAL PERFORMING ART: 10 credits, 1 year course Art, guitar, band, advdanced band, floral design.

VOCATIONAL COURSE: 10 credits, 1 year course ROP classes, NJROTC, MESA

ELECTIVES: 30 credits, 1 year course ROP classes, **OR** additional years of mathematics, science, language other than English



- 40 hours due no later than December of Senior year
